King Shot to Death in Memphis

Relief Forces Push Close to Khe Sanh

SAIGON (AP)—A U.S. task force pressed close to the Marine combat base at Khe Sanh on Friday, the fifth day of a drive to lift the long siege of the battered fortress in South Vietnam's northwest corner.

Reports Say McKeithen May Ask Fee

The relief force has met only light opposition from artillery and mortar fire since jumping off from Co Loa, 12 miles away, on Monday. Soviet reports in London said Thursday that the North Vietnamese were beginning to withdraw as a good-will gesture, but there was no confirmation from Hanoi.

Another reason advanced for the lack of sizeable opposition was the incessant American bombing by planes and from artillery in Khe Sanh itself, of North Vietnamese positions during the past three months.

In other developments early Friday:

Allied military spokesman said the Viet Cong shelled 11 U.S. and South Vietnamese military positions Thursday night and early Friday. The targets, ranging the length of the country, included the big Tan Son Nhut air base on Saigon's outskirts. The heaviest shelling was at a U.S. Army base near

At last report, lead elements of the relief force were within half a mile Thursday night of the Khe Sanh perimeter and were poised for a final push.

Gov. McKeithen may ask the legislature to raise the automobile license tag fee without proposing a constitutional amendment, the attorney general's office said Thursday.

First Asst. Atty. Gen. Carroll Buck said in an opinion requested by the governor that the Legislature may legally impose a license tax in excess of the \$3 now charged annually.

The opinion added that all additional revenues from the tax must go into the long-range highway fund.

The ruling cleared the way for McKeithen to ask lawmakers for a plan to finance a massive new road building program planned by the department.

Highway officials are calling for \$70 million in new funds annually to finance their program.

Curfew Reimposed; Guard Sent Back

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP)—Nobel Laureate Martin Luther King Jr., father of non-violence in the American Civil Rights movement, was killed by an assassin's bullet Thursday night.

King, 39, was hit in the neck by a bullet as he stood on the balcony of a motel here. He died less than an hour later in St. Joseph Hospital.

Gov. Buford Ellington immediately ordered 4,000 National Guard troops back into the city. A curfew, which was clamped on Memphis after a King-led march turned into a riot a week ago, was reimposed.

LBJ Postpones Trip to Hawaii

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson, preparing for a week-end Vietnam strategy conference in Honolulu, delayed his departure overnight Thursday because of the assassination in Memphis of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King.

The President went before television cameras and radio microphones to declare America as a "shocked and saddened" by the tragedy. He condemned violence, lawlessness and divisiveness.

Johnson also to meet in Hawaii Sunday with South Korea's president, Chung Hee Park.

Earlier in the day, Hanoi charged that American planes bombed a North Vietnamese

Police said incidents of violence, including several fire bombings were reported following King's death.

The 1964 Nobel Peace Prize winner, was standing on the balcony of his motel here, where he had come to lead protests in behalf of the city's 1,300 striking garbage workers, most of them Negroes, when he was shot.

Two unidentified men who were arrested were released several hours later.

As word of King's death spread through the stunned city, Negroes in scattered areas also looted stores, stoned police and fire trucks and tossed several fire bombs. Two policemen were injured, mainly by flying glass when a shotgun blast

Governor, HHH Hold Confidential Talk

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—Gov. McKeithen revealed Thursday he had a private, half-hour telephone conversation with Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, but their discussion was "confidential."

The governor would not say if possible Humphrey - McKeithen ticket for president was in the making. However, he said, "I certainly would consider being a vice presidential candidate with Humphrey."
